George Bateman, candidate for Club Technical Director.

Hi! I'm George Bateman and I'm a second-year chemistry student. I'm running for Technical Director of CUADC. I **care about this club** and this theatre, which is why I want to sit on this year's committee. I have experience in the role of technical director on shows, having TD'd seven shows so far in Cambridge and had a sprinkling of other roles. I attended ADC Camp 2017 and am going again in 2018. I've worked in both the ADC and the Corpus playroom, so I understand both venues from a technical perspective.

Working as either a technical director or another tech role for shows has its challenges. As Club TD, I'd be in a good position to support people who are new to technical theatre. We were all new not that long ago—I remember my freshers' show vividly!—and I believe that providing support is one of the most important parts of the job.

An area I'd like to look into is the **future of set design software**. As avid readers of the legendary gossip list will be aware, changes are being made to SketchUp which may affect our ability to use it in coming years. I've been investigating the possibility of reimplementing Jack Swanborough's ADC SketchUp plug-in in FreeCAD, which is a piece of software similar to SketchUp. If this is successful, I'd like to extend this to including some of the



stock flats, trucks, cloths and the furniture store, to make set design and planning easier. I'm open to discussions about this and hope to find a solution that works for everyone.

In the past year Theo has produced a CUADC guide to being TD on shows. This is something that I believe will really help new TDs going forward: I could certainly have benefited from it as a fresher! I will make sure this is distributed to next year's freshers, and consult them on how much it helped them, and whether there are any more areas they feel they could have been better informed about. The **guide should be a living document**, adapting over time to better fit people's needs.

Theatre tech always needs more people. The freshers' shows bring in people who are keen to jump in and manage the tech for a show straight away, but there's **no obvious entry point for those who want to get involved more casually**. I'd like to speak to other relevant societies, such as the Engineering and Science societies, about advertising events such as the Panto build which might appeal to their members. I first entered the workshop to help build the revolving stage for Panto 2016, and can confirm that it's a very fun way to start!

My name is Zak Karimjee and I am running for Club Technical Director. I have TD-ed two ADC main shows, two Corpus mains, and helped out in various fashions with a number of other shows.

TL;DR: Focussed training of new techies, teach people how to use drills, keep pushing forward on female/NB accessibility, get the TD guide out

As Club TD, I would aim to make learning about theatre tech more easy, accessible and welcoming to all. It seems to me that many people are afraid or apprehensive about using the workshop or other theatre facilities, due to a lack of confidence. There are currently workshops at the start of Michaelmas on various aspects of tech, but for anyone who misses these, I'm not aware of any provision for consciously training people.

In order to improve this situation, I would push to make myself and other more experienced techies open and available to teach people how to do what we do! This would primarily be done through encouraging the recruitment of new people to help set build for all shows, with the express intention of helping them learn. I would also like to put posters up with contact information for the technical reps so that people are encouraged to contact us if they need advice.

I would also specifically like to work on power drill skills. The drills are one of the only power tools at the ADC that you can use without training, but in my opinion they're one of the hardest & sometimes less intuitive tools to use, as well as being quite physically demanding. I've found that this often poses a significant issue at get-ins, because you don't have the spare time to teach people how to use the drills, and end up limited by the small number of people who can use them effectively.

To help with this, I'd like to run regular (bi-termly possibly) drill workshops, where people come to the workshop and screw things together without the pressure of a get in or the worry of building for a show. I also think that my previous point of encouraging new people to help set build would provide a low pressure environment to learn to use drills!

I intend to continue the efforts of the current committee to make tech more accessible to all. I would especially like to build on their work in encouraging female & non-binary people to get involved in tech; I've been pleased to see the gender ratios evening out this year and would love to see that continue. I'm also aware that there has been work on a TD guide; I'd like to try to complete it and have it published.

Thanks very much for reading and I hope I've persuaded you I'd be a good choice for club TD!





Welfare and accessibility are incredible important to me, and so basically, as Producers' Rep, I'd incorporate a really strong focus on that into the role, but equally if I wasn't, I would still want to use the role of Social and Outreach Secretary to make a difference to that aspect of Cambridge theatre.

Across those roles, here are things that I think are important/things I want to do:

☆ ACCESSIBILITY/DIVERSITY ☆

- Keep listening to marginalised voices! And continue encouraging feedback from everyone.
- Outreach!! Open this up to be more welcoming to new people. We have so much privilege in this space and there's so much that needs changing that we can start to change here.
- Remember that this is and continue to create a space for LEARNING. This is (and was for me) some people's first opportunity to do theatre.
- More workshops and talks, with *names* or otherwise -- there's a lot more on offer for people
 who want to go to drama school than people trying to do production, and advice from anyone
 who's gone into theatre/film/TV post-graduation would be amazing.
- Workshops for Edinburgh!!!

☆ CULTURE SHIFT ☆

- The way we think about some things needs to change.
- One main thing for me is money. For producers/treasurers, it can seem very abstract. We need to create a culture in which people are aware of the importance of reimbursements it can be an obstacle to involvement for some people.
- Stop being derogatory about town shows and ARU. INTEGRATE INSTEAD.
- Although shows mean a lot to us and can involve a lot of money, we should remember that this
 is not everyone's life. People have degrees, they have lives and problems -- producers, SMs,
 directors, we should be encouraging an approach that remembers that people's wellbeing is
 more important than a show.
