ENCOURAGING NEW TECHIES

I would love to explore promotion options for technical opportunities and workshops outside of the "theatre circle", and try to offer as many "stress-free" opportunities to just come along and explore with the kit as possible!

RUNNING WORKSHOPS

One thing I really want to focus on is the organisation and running of workshops, covering a variety of aspects of how technical equipment can be used in a show. These could cover the basics of how to rig a light, set up a microphone, or how to program an lx/sound cue, but I would also love to run sessions of creative exploration and discussion: covering topics such as how to use colour and shape to enhance the action and mood in a scene, how a soundscape may be constructed to evoke a particular response from the audience, or how a sense of location can be shown through subtle light or projection. I also think it would be great to invite directors to sessions like this - or even run sessions alongside a small group of other technicians purely for directors to sit down and explore the possibilities of tech in a collaborative setting!

PROMOTING GOOD PRACTICE

Good practice can not only help allow a show to reach its full creative potential, but also makes the entire process significantly more enjoyable and rewarding for both the creative minds behind a production, and those bringing it to life! By promoting good communication between directors and technicians on CUADC shows, as well as developing some short and snappy guides (mainly aimed at new technicians!), I would hope to be a small part in improving the general collaboration between departments, and in ensuring that newer or less experienced technicians can feel confident and excited for the get in and show week!
